Name and Location of Fair: Suwannee River Youth Livestock Show & Sale, Fanning Springs, Florida.

ADULT AND MINOR PARTICIPANTS:

Let it be known that all those directly associated with the Suwannee River Fair Association Inc./Suwannee River Youth Livestock Show & Sale/Suwannee River Fair (hereafter "Releasee"), including but not limited to Board Members, Staff, Show Committees, Sponsors, and Volunteers are to be held harmless and not responsible in any way in case of any damage, fire or accident as to person, lost articles, livestock, etc. entered and/or exhibited or any accidents that might occur to the exhibitor or their family, and/or the general public while visiting on the grounds at any time during fair activities. It is understood that all exhibitors entering any of the Suwannee River Fair shows and/or contests agree to comply with all General Rules and Regulations, Animal Inspections Rules & Regulations and the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, as well as the rules governing each individual show and contest.

NOTICE TO THE MINOR CHILD'S PARENT or LEGAL GUARDIAN

READ THIS FORM COMPLETELY AND CAREFULLY. YOU ARE AGREEING TO LET YOUR MINOR CHILD ENGAGE IN A POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS ACTIVITY. YOU ARE AGREEING THAT, EVEN IF RELEASEE USES REASONABLE CARE IN PROVIDING THIS ACTIVITY, THERE IS A CHANCE YOUR CHILD MAY BE SERIOUSLY INJURED OR KILLED BY PARTICIPATING IN THIS ACTIVITY BECAUSE THERE ARE CERTAIN DANGERS INHERENT IN THE ACTIVITY WHICH CANNOT BE AVOIDED OR ELIMINATED. IN CONSIDERATION of being permitted to enter any of the livestock areas at the Suwannee River Fair (*including, but not limited to, the show ring, competition areas, chutes, hog pens, steer barn, scales, washing/drying areas, areas reserved and intended for exhibitors or restricted to the general public*), or being permitted to compete, officiate, observe, work for, or for any purpose participate in any way in the event, by signing below, I agree as follows:

1. I am aware that there are livestock animals at the Suwannee River Fair and I understand that livestock can be unpredictable and dangerous at times.
2. If allowed to enter any livestock area, I agree to be mindful and aware of my surroundings in any areas that I may be in and will conduct myself in a safe and sensible manner.
3. I agree that if, at any time, I am in a livestock area and I feel anything to be unsafe, I will immediately notify Fair officials of such and will leave the area.
4. I agree not to sue any youth exhibitors, the Suwannee River Fair or any affiliate of the Fair, the Fair Board Members, Fair Superintendents, Fair Officers, or anyone else associated with the Fair for any loss or damage claimed by myself due to the injury or death of myself or any person under my care at this event.
5. I understand that the activities of the Fair can be very dangerous and could involve the risk of serious injury and/or death and/or property damage, and I assume this risk on behalf of myself and anyone under my care while at this Fair.
6. I understand that neither the Suwannee River Fair nor any of its affiliates are responsible for loss of or damage to any of my personal property or belongings while at the fairgrounds.
7. I understand that this release, waiver, and indemnity agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the Province or State in which the event is conducted and that if any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.
8. I agree the laws of the State of Florida shall govern the validity of this Release, the construction of its terms, and the interpretation of the rights and duties hereunder.

I HAVE READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY. I UNDERSTAND IT IS A WAIVER AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS. I UNDERSTAND THAT I ASSUME ALL RISK INHERENT IN THIS FAIR WHICH INVOLVES UNPREDICTABLE LIVESTOCK ANIMALS. I FREELY AND VOLUNTARILY SIGN MY NAME EVIDENCING MY ACCEPTANCE OF THE ABOVE PROVISIONS.

MARKET ANIMAL SALE, PAYMENTS, & DISTRIBUTION

RESALE RULES & PROCEDURE

1. The President will form a committee to evaluate resale options prior to the sale.
2. Sale weight on steers will be the official weigh-in weight less 3% shrinkage. Market swine and wether sale weight will be the official weigh-in weight.
3. All animals must be resold and delivered to the resale buyer.
4. No Individual resale, custom kill, or retained ownership purchases are allowed. Except for Fat Steers.
5. Feeders must be checked out to the holding pens on Sale Day or your sale check shall be subject to a 15% penalty fee.
6. Fat Steer Resale Procedures
 - a. Fat Steer exhibitors have first right of refusal on their own steer for processing. Please contact Wendy Bird by February 28 to reserve your steer. You may use your own processor; however ALL CATTLE must be processed within 45 days of sale day and a processing ticket given to Beef Superintendent within that time. This is a terminal show, therefore all cattle must be processed and cannot be shown after the conclusion of SRF.
 - b. Fat Steer bills must be paid in full by 5 pm on Tuesday of market week. Once payment is received, a paid-in full release ticket will be issued. Starting Wednesday after 8 am this release must be presented to Ashely or Houston before steers can be loaded out and removed from the premises.
 - c. Resale value will be determined using the Oklahoma Fat Steer Market price on the Monday of Market Week.
 - d. Remove the steer from the fairgrounds by 6:00p on Sale Day.

SALE RULES & PROCEDURES

1. The sale order will provide for a mixed animal sale. A certain number of swine, then a number of fat calves, then a number of feeder calves, then a number of wethers, will sell. The numbers in each "cycle" will be determined by calculations based on total numbers in each category.
2. Grand Champions in each category will sell first, then Reserve Champions in each group. Entries in each category (swine, feeders, fats, wethers) will sell based on this order while maintaining the mixed animal "cycle" described in #1 above.
3. To make sale day less chaotic and stressful,
 - a. Only champion animals will be taken through the ring. Exhibitors must be with their animal when it enters the sale ring or their animal will receive resale price only.
 - b. All other sale animals will stay in the barn. Exhibitors must be inline and ready to sell their animal or their animal will receive resale price only.
4. Each animal will be sold separately to the highest bidder.
5. Auctioneer will determine the highest bidder and settle all disputes.
6. A resale price will be established and announced at the beginning of the sale. **All resale credit will go to the exhibitor.**
7. Any person buying animals for another party must sign their name to the purchase contract and is legally responsible for the payment of the bill.

FAIR SALE CHECK COLLECTION & DISTRIBUTION TIMELINE

EXHIBITOR SALE CHECK DISTRIBUTION RULES & PROCEDURES

1. All market animal participants are **REQUIRED** to write an appropriate thank you letter to all buyers.
 2. Letters **MUST BE HANDWRITTEN** and placed in an unsealed, stamped, addressed envelope.
 3. No Torn Pages, and or Frayed Edges will be excepted.
 4. Letters **AT THE MINIMUM MUST** include must include 2 or 3 well written paragraphs NO FORM LETTERS. Cards are acceptable as long as all other criteria are met.
 5. Return Address for all Thank You letters PO Box 252, Trenton, FL 32693
 6. **Thank you, letters are due May 31st.** All thank you letters shall be given to the 4-H Agent or FFA Advisor for mailing. 4-H Agents and FFA Advisors will notify the Fair Secretary, at least weekly, as to receipt of Thank You Letters. After the last day of school all thank you letters will be submitted to the Fair Secretary.
 7. Sale check will be mailed in participants name to the legal guardian address upon receipt of an appropriate thank you letter(s) from exhibitor to their buyer(s).
 8. The mailing address will be obtained from the official mailing address of the legal parent/guardian on the Market Animal Entry Form.
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GENERAL FAIR RULES & REGULATIONS

FOR ALL SHOWS & CONTESTS

1. The Suwannee River Fair Association (SRF) reserves to its Board of Directors, the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations.
2. The SRF reserves all rights to make changes to individual shows, events, and/or rules and regulations throughout the year as the Executive Board deem necessary for the betterment, improvement and safety of exhibitors, volunteers, and guests.
3. All animals will be the responsibility of the exhibitor and remain in their designated area during the feeding period or until released by show committee. The care and welfare of the shows animals will be checked periodically by FFA advisors, county Agents, 4-H leaders and/or board members.
4. The website <https://mysrf.org> has entry forms, record books, updates and changes to any rule.
5. Online registration is at <https://suwannee.fairwire.com>. The online portal will close 2 days prior to the mail-in entry deadline.
6. The Fair will not be responsible for any actions by the US Post Office concerning entries or thank you letters. This includes letters lost or delayed through the mail.
7. No animals, concessions or goods may be advertised for sale on the fairgrounds unless officially sanctioned by the Board of Directors.
8. Use of drugs in animals not in compliance with manufacturer's label as to dosage, time of withdrawal limitations, or other manufacturer's limitations and show regulations is prohibited. The use of tranquilizers or possession of same after arrival at the Fair will be construed as tampering.
9. **SRF Association Resale Buyer Quality Assurance & Drug Statement** This is to acknowledge that I have been advised that the presence of any drug, antibiotic or biological residue in my market animal at slaughter will result in the condemnation of the carcass and forfeiture of all sale proceeds and premiums. I certify that any drug, antibiotic or biological substance which may have been administered by myself or any other person, was done so in strict compliance with the manufacturer's label requirements or as prescribed by a veterinarian. I certify that I produced this animal, it was not fed any prohibited feedstuffs and all feeds were fed in strict compliance with the manufacturer's label instructions.
10. Show officials may refuse participation in any show, contest or sale, any exhibit or exhibitor who they feel is not a credit to the fair and/or does not adhere to all rules and regulations.
11. The decisions of Judges, Graders, FDACS Inspectors and other officials of the fair are final. There will be no arguments, verbal or written, or protest to the fair Judges or Graders. Protests are allowed under the provisions of SRF general rule #13.
12. Any disagreement or protest regarding any fair activities must be made in writing to the Fair Board President. The executive board will consider such protests and a decision rendered as soon as possible.

CODE OF CONDUCT

13. Exhibitors and exhibitor's parents are expected to adhere to the following rules of conduct at all fair sanctioned events. Failure to do so could result in forfeiture of all premiums, awards and elimination or expulsion from participation in the current or future fair events.
 - a. Abide by all SRF rules and regulations.
 - b. Consumption, possession of alcoholic beverages on fair property or being under the influence of such beverages is strictly forbidden.
 - c. The use of profanity or fighting on fair property is forbidden.
 - d. The possession of firearms by anyone under the age of 18 on fair property is forbidden. Adults must secure firearms in locked vehicles when left unattended.
 - e. No open fires are permitted on fair property.
 - f. Any intentional destruction or abuse of Fair property will be grounds for immediate expulsion from the fair grounds and/or activities.
 - g. No improper comments or conduct toward buyers, fair officials or volunteers will be tolerated.

EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY & RESPONSIBILITY

14. Participants in the Suwannee River Fair, MUST live or attend school in Dixie, Gilchrist or Levy Counties. Individuals not meeting this requirement must apply to the Suwannee River Fair Association for exemption to participate. Refer to Application For Participation in Suwannee River Fair.
15. Participants in SRF must be certified members in good standing of 4-H or FFA in Dixie, Gilchrist or Levy Counties. Verification of membership is the sole responsibility of the advisors or agents and implies member compliance with national, state and local membership rules and policy. Membership is certified initially by the signature of the appropriate Advisor, Agent or Leader on the appropriate entry form. Final certification from Advisor or Agent will be verified from SRF Master Entry List.
16. **Age Divisions: Junior (8-10), Intermediate (11-13), and Senior (14+)** shall be uniform throughout the Fair. **The base age date for all shows: September 1, 2025.**
 - a. Except Horse: Beginner any age, **Intermediates 11-13 can choose to compete in either the Junior or Senior division.**
 - b. Exhibitors who are not 8 years old by **9/1/2025** cannot participate in Large Animal Projects.

17. **4-H Cloverbuds** are 4-H members who are 5, but not 8 years old as of [9/1/2025](#).
 - a. Cloverbuds may not compete for any awards and/or prizes. They may enter and participate only in events specific to their age group.
 - b. Cloverbuds are eligible for participation in Exhibition Only classes in Creative Life Skills, Small Animal Shows, Dog Rally, some Showmanship classes, and record books.
 - c. Cloverbud entries will be judged and awarded green ribbons of participation. See Specific Shows for Rules and Regulations.
 - d. A Cloverbud Liability Release Sheet or record book is required.
18. **SRF Dress Code:** All exhibitors participating in Shows, Sale, and Awards Program will be required to be clean, neat and dressed in black pants or skirts, a solid white button up shirt with a white collar and dark or green tie. 4-H or FFA Jacket or 4-H Vest are required. Closed-toed shoes with backs or boots are required. No hats or caps allowed. **Show and Contest Exceptions:** Cloverbuds may wear 4-H Accessories. Contest participants refer to contest dress code requirements. Dairy Cow and Goat participants may wear white pants and shirt. Dog Show participant refer to show dress code rules. Horse Show participants are required to wear attire, boots and helmet appropriate to riding style.
19. **Buyer's Invitation:** It is the exhibitors responsibility to help get new and returning buyers to come to the livestock sales.
20. Exhibitor must be ready to enter the arena on time. Once class has started no late entries or early exits will be allowed.

EXHIBITOR ENTRIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

21. Animals must be entered at the initial and final entry time.
22. Exhibitors must own in full any animal exhibit offered for sale.
23. No individual may show and/or sell more than one **SALE** animal per year.
24. All Market exhibitors are eligible to enter or tag in two of the same market animals. Only one will be allowed at the final weigh-in in March. The exhibitor will be responsible for the sale of the second animal.
25. Chapter/Club and siblings may use the same 2nd animal as their backup. Everyone must enter with their own entry form for that animal and pay all applicable fees.
26. If a market animal dies within 30 days after tag-in or weigh-in the animal may be replaced upon verification by two committee members. However, after the 30 days under no circumstances will a replacement be allowed. A replacement animal will have to be re-tagged within 7 days of the death. Replacement steer – The steer may not be more than 100 lbs. heavier than original weight at tag-in.
27. ALL market animals must be reared at the exhibitor's home or school they attend throughout the entire project unless granted permission by the board. If not kept at the exhibitor's home or school a letter addressed to the board with the proposed location and explanation of why must be turned in at time of tag in for consideration. This relocation must be within the Levy, Dixie, or Gilchrist foot print **NO EXEPTIONS**. Exhibitors are subject to random home visits from the time of the initial tag-in to the time of the final weigh-in by an Advisor, Leader, or SRF Board/Committee Member. Anyone not abiding by this rule will **NOT** be eligible to show at the March Fair!
28. Market animals that show must sell. Exhibitor owns the animal until it goes on the trailer of the resale buyer after the sale
29. Chapter or club animals must be shown and sold by someone that does not have a market animal in the show.
30. Exhibitors must show and sell, his/her own animal unless the show committee approves an alternate.
31. All exhibits must be picked up no later than the time and date listed in the schedule of events or show barn for each show and division.
32. Early removal of exhibits may result in loss of ribbons and future showing privileges.
33. For the safety of all exhibitors, any animal that becomes loose or unruly while in the show ring due to lack of control by the exhibitor shall be penned or tied to the fence for the remainder of the class.
34. **STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING:** By signing and submitting an entry to the Suwannee River Youth Fair, the exhibitor, parents, leaders, and advisors agree that they have read and agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations as published by the Suwannee River Fair Association, and that all information on the entry form is true. By signing the entry form you release the Suwannee River Fair Association and those directly associated with it from any liability to your person or property and you consent to the use, by the Fair, of any pictures taken during the events for promotion or advertising of the Suwannee River Youth Fair.
35. **LIABILITY WAIVER:** Parent/Guardian and/or Exhibitor must sign and submit a Parental Permission, Release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement with their entry form, online must mail in.
36. **WRIST BANDS:** Colored wrist band will be issued to exhibitor and parent/guardian. Wristbands are required to enter restricted livestock areas of the fair grounds.
37. **Entry Forms:** Exhibitors must enter their animals on a completed official entry form that has been signed by the exhibitor, exhibitor's parent or guardian, and the FFA Advisor, 4-H Agent or 4-H Leader. Entry forms are due according to Registration Deadlines and with the correct fees. No refunds will be made after entry deadline.

38. **Entry Fees:** Exhibitors must enter their animals on a completed official entry form that has been signed by the exhibitor, exhibitor's parent or guardian, and the FFA Advisor, 4-H Agent or 4-H Leader. Entry forms are due according to Registration Deadlines and with the correct fees. No refunds will be made after entry deadline.

39. **Registration Deadlines:** All paperwork is the responsibility of the exhibitor and entry forms are due into the show superintendents no later than:
- a. **Market Steer & Swine Animals:** On the day of Weight/Tag-in.
 - b. **Market Wether Animals:** Forms must be post marked by the 1st Tuesday in December of the current fair year.
 - c. **Breeding Goat Does:** Forms must be post marked by the 3rd Tuesday in September of the current fair year. Entries post marked after the deadline but on or before the 4th Tuesday of September will be accepted at double the entry fee.
 - d. **Non-Sale Animals:** Forms must be post marked by the 1st Tuesday in December of the current fair year. Entries post marked after the deadline but on or before the 2nd Tuesday of December will be accepted at double the entry fee. Exhibitors are encouraged to include a self-addressed, stamped post card which will be returned upon receipt of their entry forms. A list of all received entries will be posted on the Fair website. Dropped off forms will not be accepted.
 - e. [The Online registration is at https://suwannee.fairwire.com](https://suwannee.fairwire.com). The online portal will close 2 days prior to the mail-in entry deadline.
40. **Mandatory Drug and Quality Assurance Sheet or Record Book Receipt:**
- a. All animal exhibitors **MUST** complete a Drug and Quality Assurance Sheet or a Record Book for each animal project they enter.
 - b. The completed drug assurance sheet or record book receipt will be presented to the show committee check-in station, where they will be examined for completeness.
 - c. **Incomplete Information:** The exhibitor and their animal **WILL BE** diverted out of line to an area where they will complete the required information.
 - d. The exhibitor's hand will be stamped for entry into the scale house and barns.
 - e. **Optional Record Book Contest:** Refer to Contests and Other Events Rules.
41. **Showmanship Contests – General Rules:**
- a. There will be [Junior \(8-10\)](#), [Intermediate \(11-13\)](#), and [Senior \(14+\)](#) divisions.
 - b. [Make sure you understand the rules for your animal. Some are required, some need preregistration, and others are entered at March weigh-in.](#)
 - c. Refer to show division for specific criteria on participation.
 - d. The exhibitor must show his own animal. No one will be allowed to participate unless they have an official entry in the show and division. Exhibitors of chapter or club animal may compete in the showmanship contest, 1 per club/chapter by designated club leader or chapter advisor.
 - e. Awards may be given to the top three (3) showmen in each show category.

ANIMAL INSPECTION RULES & REGULATIONS

42. All animals shall enter the show grounds through the North gate, unless specified in SRF Division and Show.
43. Exhibitors will be required to maintain their exhibits in a clean and attractive manner, properly care for (feed and water) animal exhibits, for the duration of the Fair. Inspections will be performed by the Board.
44. **Proper Care:** If your animal is reported for lack of care and the grievance is found to be valid, the pen will be tagged with a date and time. Once your pen is tagged you must immediately report to the office/show superintendent. If the problem or concern is not corrected you will be withdrawn from the show.
45. State Veterinarian, USDA representative, SRF Grievance Committee or their representative reserve the right not to accept animals if they appear to be unhealthy, infected with external parasites (such as lice, mites & fleas), malnourished, or not in the best interest of the fair.
46. There will be no medicating of animals, unless approved by SRF Grievance Committee or their representative.
47. If illness appears during the course of the Fair, the SRF Grievance Committee or their representative reserve the right to remove animals from the barn that day.
48. Liability in case of death or injury to any exhibited animal remains with the exhibitor until released from Fair.
49. All health rules as outlined by the Suwannee River Fair and the Florida Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Industry must be adhered to. State inspectors will be on the grounds to verify health papers and check in all animals. No animals will be unloaded without the inspector's approval. The State Inspector has the right to test any animal on the facility without prior notice under **Florida Statutes 5C-4.0017 General Requirements & Limitations**.

GOAT GENERAL REGULATIONS & REQUIREMENTS

1. The SRF General Rules and Regulations apply to this Division and Shows.
2. Health Requirements:
 - a. 5C-4.0017 General Requirements & Limitations.
 - b. 5C-4.005 Goat: Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) from a veterinarian. Florida-origin goats presented for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation. Goats imported into Florida for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI completed within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - c. All entered goats registered, unregistered, or grade must have a scrapie ID (Individual Identification) number that meets the identification requirements mandated by the USDA (APHIS 91-55-066, June 1, 2005).
 - d. Goats shall be free of any health or skin illnesses, and free of lice.
 - e. All goats must be polled or have their horns either tipped or cushioned with a material to help prevent injury to the exhibitor. No tipping of horns on the show grounds.
 - f. Each exhibitor must provide their own equipment to maintain the health of their animal and the cleanliness of their pens. Bring latching device for pen gates. ALL EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO FEED and WATER UNTIL ANIMALS ARE REMOVED FROM BARN. If animal(s) is not tended to, Fair Premiums and/or Eligibility may be revoked if conditions continue. Bedding, is provided by the fair.
3. **Shows and Classes:**
 - a. Spectators, parents and/or breeders are not allowed in the back once exhibitors are in line to show.
 - b. Meat and Dairy goats are separate shows. A goat cannot be shown in both shows.
 - c. There must be a minimum of **10 entries** to host a show. In the event of limited entries, the non-qualifying show exhibitors can still participate in the running show and will be judged to that show standard.
 - d. No Bucks will be allowed to show.
 - e. Does over 24 months that have not kidded cannot be shown.
 - f. Base Date is the age of the animal on the day of the show. Date of birth must be included on entry form.
 - g. Exhibitors will be allowed to use halters or collars in the show ring.
 - h. Exhibitors will be in control of their goat at all times or they may be dismissed/disqualified from the show.
4. **Proof of Ownership:**
 - a. All animals must be owned or leased by the show entry deadline. Lease agreement must be attached to entry form.
 - b. Scrapie/ Premise ID or Tattoo ID must be included on entry form or entry will be considered incomplete and not accepted.
 - c. All exhibitors entries owned or leased must maintain continuous full ownership, possession and provide primary care for their animal project from time of entry until show day. If at entry time the animal is not in the exhibitor's possession the entry will be invalid and no refund given. A farm visit is up to the discretion of the SRF leadership.
 - d. Only doe goats owned the entire duration as the entry form may be subbed out in the case of death per superintendent approval.
5. **Show Entry:**
 - a. All goats must be checked in after vet check. All animals not checked in will be considered "No Shows" and will be deleted from the show.
 - b. Goats with Tattoos will need to bring their registration paperwork at check-in.
 - c. Only animals exhibited, entered, shown and checked by the State health inspectors will be allowed in the barn. No exceptions. Kids under 3 months of age and still nursing their dam may be brought into the barn after check-in. If kids are buckling's they will not be part of the show.
 - d. Once animals are checked in they cannot leave the grounds until show is complete.
 - e. All goats must be broken to lead, clipped and washed prior to arrival at the fairgrounds. See Wether Rules for clipping instructions.
 - f. There will be No Body Clipping Of Goats on the fair grounds. Minor trimming, washing, grooming and fitting as necessary for show appearance is allowed.
6. **Showmanship is Optional**
 - a. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine Dairy Doe and Meat Doe shows for Showmanship if there are less than 4 in each age division.
 - b. Prior of show entry date, if there are less than 4 exhibitors in an age division the superintendent reserves the right to withhold belt buckle.


SEED STOCK DOE REPLACEMENT YOUTH SHOW AND SALE RULES

1. This will be a **bid board sale** with no auctioneer required.
2. The exhibitor will be required to set a minimum reserve/price point for their animal.
3. We will have designated phone number for all call-in bids as well as in person bidding.
4. This is not a sales market donation type; the winning bid will own the goat and take it home.
5. This will be a different set of funds from the surrounding counties.
6. Exhibitors can enter multiple animals in the show but can only have one for the sale.
7. They will be required to do a bio-write-up and take photos for a sales catalog due 3 weeks before fair check-in date.
8. It will go live 2 weeks before the show and sale. Lot numbers will be assigned at this point for pre-bidding. This date is to ensure it doesn't go stale. Once the catalog is live bids will open. The final bid will be listed once the show is established.
9. This show and sale will be advertised in the following locations, social media, our website, feed stores, vets, Extension offices, processing plants, and possibly local papers.
10. Potential awards will be – Best Marketing, Sales talk at pen, Career Showman will include all scores and arena showmanship in an interview type process.
11. At conclusion of the auction, the highest bidder buyer is responsible for making the full payment before the animal can leave. Once bidding has ended the winning bidder (buyer), will contact the exhibitor (seller) directly and all monetary transactions will be handled directly between the two parties. SRF will not be involved in part of the payment or transaction.
12. Full payment must be received before the animal is allowed to leave the premises, a paid bill of sale must be provided by the exhibitor (seller), and the ownership has be transferred.

BREEDING MEAT & DAIRY DOE SHOW RULES

1. The Goat General Rules and Regulations apply to all shows.
2. Entry fees are \$30 with each additional animal being \$15 per head.
3. Exhibitors may enter unlimited entries. If an exhibitor has more than one entry per class they must have another goat exhibitor show that entry.

4. Classes will be established after check-in at the discretion of the show committee based on the number of entries. There must be a minimum of 10 entries to host a show. In the event of limited entries, the non-qualifying show exhibitors can still participate in the running show and will be judged to that show standard.
5. Does will be shown in Divisions. Classes will be divided into three divisions
 - a. Division 1 – 12 months and younger (milk teeth)
 - b. Division 2 – 12 – 24 months (2 adult teeth)
 - c. Division 3 – 24 months and up (4 teeth)
4. Grand and Reserve in each division will compete for an overall Grand and Reserve Champion doe.
5. All does must have scrapie tag, tattoo (registration paperwork to match) or microchip in place and match health certificate
6. Fitting will be allowed

MARKET WETHER SHOW RULES

1. The Goat General Rules and Regulations apply to this show and contests.
2. Exhibitors is limited to 1 entry.
3. Registration Deadline: Forms must be post marked by the 1st Tuesday in December of the current fair year. No Late Registration
4. Wethers must show no evidence of testicular tissue and be completely healed from castration.
5. Use of muzzles is optional on market goats.
6. Must be shorn to within 3/8 inch or less above the knees and hock joints prior to entering the show.

7. Bracing will be allowed in the wether goat division.
8. Goats will be divided into 3 classes by weight – Light, Medium and Heavy
9. Goats will be weighed from 50 – 200 lbs, No age requirements.
10. Class breaks will be determined at the discretion of the division superintendent.
11. A 13% sales commission will be deducted from the exhibitor's proceeds.

TRI COUNTY BORN AND BRED WETHER SHOW (locally bred and born genetics): Will be open to any goat breeder that resides (lives) in our three counties Dixie, Gilchrist & Levy. There will be a section for this information on the entry form. This section will need to have the breeder's name, farm name, premise ID and contact information (phone and address). Must include the breeders certified scrapie tag at the time of entry and show. We will be verifying the animal. This show animals dam must have been owned by the Breeder at the time of conception and the dam (includes recips) must have given birth on one of our three counties breeders farms. The wether must also be raised in one of these three counties.

HOMEGROWN SHOW: This show animal's dam must have been owned by the family (parents, grandparents, or legal guardian) at the time of conception and the dam (includes recips) must have given birth on the family farm and **be raised on the family farm.**

MARKET WETHER TEAM FITTING CONTEST

Contest Time: 30 minutes

The Contest will take place at 5 pm with in the arena. Contestants will be required to attend a mandatory meeting prior to the contest held the day of check in. There will be three age divisions. Exhibitors must follow the Code of Ethics in the Rules and Regulations section of the Premium Book.

1. To enter you must check the entry form box. Sign up must be completed at check-in with team members names. The team will be issued an entry number and this number must be displayed during the contest.
2. Participants must be a current market wether show exhibitor
3. Each team will consist of no more than two individuals.
4. Each team will be required to furnish and fit one wether. The animal must be an eligible entry at the **current** Suwannee River Youth Fair and the animal must also be owned by one of the team members.
5. The animal needs to be clean to start (washed and dried), no products, free of any artificial substances (no mousse, foams, etc.) are allowed on the animal upon entering the competition area. Animals will be checked for products before entering the competition area. The animal may be lightly misted with water to confirm that the animal is unfitted.
6. Each team is responsible for obtaining/provide their own fitting equipment and supplies used to fit their animal.
7. It is the responsibility of the contestant to have their equipment in place 15 minutes prior to the start of the contest.
8. Once the contest begins, no team member may leave the area and no additional equipment may be brought into the fitting area.
9. Each team will be allowed 30 minutes to fit their animal.
10. Contestants may not use inappropriate fitting methods. Unethical fitting situations include but are not limited to the addition of any hair or hair like substances (including twine). All fitting techniques must be within acceptable practices, Any Exhibitor caught using unethical fitting practices could result in disqualification.
11. Only contestants and officials will be allowed in contest area. All audience members must stay out of the area designated as the contest space and are not allowed to communicate with the participants in any fashion. No assistance or coaching will be allowed once contest begins.
12. Judge will circulate and question participants during the 30 mins.
13. Periodic time announcements will be made throughout the contest. A 10-minute warning will be given. At the end of the 30-minute allotted time, clippers down and work stopped.
14. Once time has been called, all teams must cease working on their animal. If fitting is continued after time is called, the team will be automatically disqualified.
15. After fitting time, each team member must be beside the animal, but are not allowed to continue fitting the animal after time is called.
16. Once released from the competition all animals must be broken down and products washed from the animal.
17. Rules will be strictly enforced
18. Exhibitors will be judged based upon the following criteria and points/scoring will be awarded/based as/on follows:
 - a. Quality of workmanship (ability to fit)
 - b. Team Skills – collaboration, organization, and participation of each team member
 - c. Compatibility of the use of various types of grooming equipment and supplies.
 - d. Overall completion and final appearance of the animal
 - e. Judge's questions for team members (response to these will be related to their knowledge of the animal, products, or fitting methods)
 - f. Neatness of individuals and area will be in consideration.

MARKET WETHER PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST

Entry Fee: None

Junior Division: Minimum of 3 minutes and maximum of 5 minutes.

Topic: [How do you get a goat ready for a show?](#)

Intermediate Division: Minimum of 4 minutes and maximum of 6 minutes.

Topic: [What are some short terms and long-term goals for your herd?](#)

Senior Division: Minimum of 5 minutes and maximum of 7 minutes.

1. Electronic devices will not be allowed in the holding area or contest room.
2. Materials: two 3x5 note cards can be used, absolutely no outside materials are allowed. Excessive reference to notes may result in deduction of points.
3. The use of visual aids are not allowed.
4. Dress: no required dress, but it is important to keep in mind that appearance is important.
5. Each contestant must make the presentation without a microphone.
6. Contestants will penalized one point per second on each judges score sheet for being over or under the time allowed.
7. Ties: in the event of tie, it will be broken by comparing scores in the following judging sections:
 - a. Content
 - b. Delivery
 - c. Language

MARKET WETHER SALES TALK CONTEST

Entry Fee: None

Sales talk uses a live setting complete with a live animal, photo or pedigree and potential buyers. This contest is a mock sales situation – you are selling your animal to a buyer. The purpose is to evaluate the effectiveness of the presentation and the contestant's ability to merchandise their project goat. Contestants will be judged on their knowledge of the animal, semen or embryos they are selling, their ability to relay important information and their overall effectiveness in convincing the judges to buy their product.

1. **Time allotted:** 4–7 minutes
2. **Materials:** A live animal (another individual may hold the animal), photo, (no larger than 8 x 10) or registration certificate for the animal, semen, or embryos being "sold"
3. **Dress:** There is no required dress, but it's important to keep in mind that appearance is important when marketing yourself and your animals.
4. **Ties:** in the event of a tie Scores will be compared and broken into the following order:
 - a. Knowledge/ Introduction
 - b. Organization/Style
 - c. Delivery
 - d. Response to questions

MARKET WETHER SKILL-A-THON CONTEST

Entry Fee: None

Skill-a-ton is a contest to test your knowledge of the goat industry

1. Each age division will have their own test.
2. The number of questions per test will vary per year. 25 –50 questions
3. A moderator will be present.
4. If you have trouble reading, make sure to let us know upon arrival and an assistant will help you with reading your quiz.
5. Pens and pencils are provided
6. Casual dress
7. The use of electronic devices is prohibited. Any contestant found to be using a phone, headphones, watches or any other electronic device will be disqualified from the contest.
8. Once you've entered the contest you must complete your test. You will not be permitted to leave and reenter. If you are found to exit the contest with the physical copy of the test you will be disqualified for the current year and the following years contest.

Entry Dates: Record Books **MUST** be turned in at the fair grounds and are due the first Wednesday in March between 4:00p-8:00p unless show occurs before this date. Then record books are due at time of show.

1. Exhibitors who complete a record book for an animal do not have to also complete a project summary sheet for the same animal.
 2. Record books not turned in on time may still be used to enter animal into the fair, but **WILL NOT** be judged.
 3. Individual Contest. Primary, Junior, and Senior age divisions.
 4. Age Divisions for the contest will be grouped as follows:
 - a. **Junior** division (ages 8-10)
 - b. **Intermediate** division (ages 11-13)
 - c. **Senior** division (ages 14+)
 - d. **4-H Cloverbuds** are Not eligible to participate in Record Book Contest
 5. Record Book Divisions for the contest will be grouped as follows:
 - a. **Market Animals** (Fat Steer, Feeder Steer, Swine, Wether)
 - b. **Non-Market Animals** (Beef Bull, Beef Heifer, Dairy Cow, Dairy Doe, Dog, Horse, Meat Doe, Poultry, Rabbit)
 6. Exhibitors may enter 1 record book per show they are participating in.
 7. Record book committee will appoint qualified judges, who are not immediate relatives.
 8. Rubrics will be provided in the back of each record book template for all participants. These rubrics will then be used to score individual books.
 9. Ribbon Awards: Blue 90-100 points; Red 80-89 points; White 70-79 points; Green 69 points & below.
 10. Awards: First, second and third place may be awarded.
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
