- 5. Cattle must be halter broken in March. A screening committee appointed by the board of directors may sift out any animal that becomes unruly and dangerous at any time during the show and sale. Sifted cattle will not be sold by the Association and must be removed from the grounds.

Put the envelope and guile sheet into a plastic bag and hang it on the same hanger as the gam ent Exhibitors who draft their own pattern should write that information and their entry form number on an index card as wellas a brief description of how they assembled their gam ent and put the card in the plastic bag in place of the guile sheet and pattern envelope.
- 3. A personal data form is due at the time the clothing exhibit is entered into the fair.
- 4. Repurposed C bthing: participants designs and sews a wearable gament from previously used materials. The completed gament is di erent from its original use.
- 5. Belts may be professionally made and finished gaments professionally pressed, but must be so labeled.
- A ccessories constructed to complement cbthing entry (shoes, hat, purse, jew ely, etc) will be entered into appropriate division for judging and will not be judged as an ensemble.

FOOD SHOW RULES

- 1. Food containing UN -BAKED ingredients such as custaid, cream cheese, or new eggs will be accepted. HOW EVER, this division does not have accessibility to refrigeration before, during or after the judging session. Entries deem ed as unsafe will not be tasted by the judges.
- 2. A lcakes and breads entered into the Food Division will be released from 4 0 0 p-5 0 0 p on Saturday. Perishables not picked up at this time will be disposed of by show superintendent. Pictures will be taken of food item s to be displayed at the fair.
- 3. For each entry, write the exhibitor's entry form number on a smallpiece of white paper and attach to the underside of the exhibit.
- 4. With the exception of pies foods must be set on cariboard covered alum inum foil. No cake plates orglass pie dishes will be accepted.
 - a) Forsmalleritems such as cookies, mu ins, candies, nolls orbiscuits, place 6 of them on a 6"x6" foil-covered cardboard and coveras necessary.
 - b) Largeriems such as cakes and bread should be entered on a follcovered cardboard and coveras necessary. No cake should exceed a quarter of a sheet cake.
- Recipes are mandatory and must be stapled to the entry form with the exhibitor's entry form number clearly written across the top.<u>Do notwrite exhibitors name on</u> <u>recipe cards</u>. The use of box mikes and bread machines are prohibited.
- 6. A lecipes will be kept to be used in a future fair cookbook.

PRESERVED FOOD SHOW RULES

- 1. Entries may be either sweetor savory.
- 2. A lentries must have been preserved within the last year (12 months). Preservation means foods are stable at room temperature, not needing additional refrigeration or cooling for safety. NO TE: Refrigerator products are not preserved, and not eligible.
- 3. Aljars must be cleargless (standard) canning jars of half-pint (8 oz), pint (16 oz), or quart (32 oz) size. Jars must be clean. Rings and lids should be free from rust. No other jars will be accepted ! A lproducts must be sealed by water bath or pressure canner.
- 4. Exhibitorm ust submit two (2) just for each entered item : one for exhibiting and one that can be opened for testing.
- 5. Dehydrated Food:Use a glass jarw ith a subbergasket in the lid to provide a better sealorvacuum ed sealed bags.
- 6. Unsealed exhibits or products showing signs of spoilage will not be judged.
- 7. Jars or vacuum sealed bags must be labeled with the name of product and date canned. Entries without required labeling will not be judged.
- 8. Fancy padded lids, fabric overlaps or overcozies interfere with the judging process and should not be used.
- 9. Recipes are mandatory and must be stapled to the entry form .Do not write name on recipe cards.
- 10. A linecipes will be kept to be used in a future fair cookbook.

HANDICRAFT SHOW RULES

- 1. This Show Is Not Responsible For Breakage!
- 2. Glass entries or entries with glass components will not be accepted.
- 3. In general, hand it raffs are item s that are ined ble and have not been hand or machine sticked. K is are not permitted with the exception of paint-by-num berk is for C by burbuds and Primaries.
- 4. Each exhibit must come with an explanation of how it was made. The explanation should be printed or typed on an index card. Both the card and the form must be attached to the exhibit.
- 5. Item s must be ready for their intended use. This means that pictures and otherworks of art intended for hanging must be ready to hang or will be disqualified.
- 6. Pothangers should have unbreakable pots rather than clay or pottery pots.
- 7. Allhemming and finishing must be the work of the exhibitor.

PHOTOGRAPHY SHOW RULES

- 1. No Frames, Glass Or Plexiglas Will Be Allowed!
- 2. A photo entry may be etherblack/white or cobr, processed from a negative or a digital cam era and must be taken by the exhibitor.
- 3. The exhibit must have a short explanation of why the picture was taken and chosen for entry. The explanation should be printed or typed on an index card. Both the card and the entry form must be attached to the exhibit.
- 4. Exhibitors may submit lentry as either: A series of photos: picture sequence or story showing a bgical progression of in ages, or an individual photo.
- 5. Pictures should depict activities typical of those in which a 4-H or FFA m em ber and their friends would likely participate.
- 6. The photo must be mounted on foam board. Maximum size for a single photo is 8"x10".

TEXTILE SHOW RULES

- 1. Textiles are made with fabric oryan that has been hand orm achine stiched orboth.
- 2. Kits may be used, but that inform ation must be plainly noted.
- 3. Each exhibit must come with an explanation of how it was made and whethera kit was used. The explanation should be printed or typed on an index card. Both the card and the entry form must be attached to the exhibit and have the exhibitor's name on them.
- 4. Entries must be complete and ready to use.Forexample:a counted cross-stich sampler should be framed and ready to hang.However,NO GLASS!! Labelany items that have been professionally framed.
- 5. Liquid embroidery is acceptable if at least 25% of the item is stitched, crocheted or otherwise needle worked.

DOG GENERAL REGULATIONS & REQUIREM ENTS

- 1. The SRFG eneralRules and Regulations apply to this Division and Shows.
- 2. Exhibitors ages 5-7 as of 9/10f the current yearm ay register to compete in exhibition only classes with rally and showmanship.Green ribbons will awarded and youth will be provided feedback, but will not be scored or ranked.
- 3. Exhibitors are REQ URED to attend 3 dog practices at SRF with each dog that they are showing, with lbeing before the entry deadline in December to determ ine their competition leveland guarantee the safety of this event. Severalworkshops will be o ered throughout the year, please contact the show superintendent for further details.
- 4. More information about each division show will be housed on the SRF Dog Project Facebook page and mystforg website.
- 5. Health Requirem ents:
 - a. A signed veterinarian slip with the dog's vaccination record covering expiration date must be attached to the entry form with rabies and DHPP.
 - b. Allpurebred and mixed breed dogs, at bast 6 m on ths of age.
 - c. A fem all dog in season will not be permitted to show or be present during the show even if they have been registered for the event; they also cannot attend practice while in season. If you are showing an unalered fem ale, please plan to attend at least 1 practice with 1 back up dog to ensure you have another dog to show at the SRF.
 - d. Dogs must be wellgroom ed, washed and brushed with all mats removed from the coat, ears clean and nails trimmed.
- 5. Only animals being shown at the Suwannee River Fairwill be allowed on show grounds.
- 6. Dogs are not permitted anywhere on the Fairgrounds except with their handler in the Arena & groom ing areas. Anyone found violating this rule will be disqualified from the show.
- 7. Keep safety and common sense in mind ataltimes. Dogs must be bashed or crated ataltimes outside of class requirements. A locates must be placed in the designated area. Only exhibitors and lof their parents/guardians will be allowed in the crate area. It is recommended to keep dogs in the safety of their crate throughout the day when not competing.
- 8. Alldogs must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor or their in mediate fam ily; how ever, dogs may be based/baned to the exhibitor with a base agreement.
- 9. Two members of the same family may show the same dog. The Dog will be allowed in each class one time.
- 10. Each owner/handler's response for their dog's behavior. Any dog exhibiting acts of aggression will be excluded from participation. Uncontrolable or aggressive dogs must be immediately be removed from grounds.

- 11. Dogs must have been tained by theiryouth handler. No dog shallbe individually hands-on tained by a professional dog tainer.
- 12. While on the faignounds, only the exhibitor should handle, tain, work, prepare or groom his/herdog. Disregard of this rule will result in disqualification. Adults are strictly prohibited from providing direct assistance in preparation or showing of animals unless exception is permitted by the fairboard, requests must be made in advance, in writing in order to be considered.

Show and Classes

- B. FullSRF o is includents is required. Skits are permitted for show manship, but it is recommended that a lexhibitors we are parts for ally, agaily, and obedience.
- 14. Bring proper leash and collar for each class entered. As well as treats, water, crate, and bts of patience!
- 15. Dogs must be on a bash at all times, except during advanced, o -bash exercises. A 6 foot bash with a choke-chain ornybn taining collar. No tags, attachments, bad collars, chain bash, orhaness will be accepted. Pinch collars may be used for taining only.
- 16. Coaching from the railwillnot be permitted. In addition, on show day, only handler/ dog pairs, fairboard members, judges, and appointed ring volunteers will be permitted in the show ring.
- 17. Alclasses may be divided into age divisions if the number of entries received warant it at the Show Committees discretion.
- 18. Dogs must be entered in a class comparable to their level of training. If required, the Show C om mittee shalldeterm ine proper/in proper class entry for the handler/dog. In this case, they will be allowed to participate but will not receive scores or placement for the inconnect class.
- 19. Basic and 8-11 yearold handlers may enter 1 dog. Experienced handlers or handlers 11+ years of age as of Septem ber 1st of the current 4-H yearm ay choose to exhibit up to 2 dogs. Dogs may not exhibit in the same class.
- 20. Each exhibitor will be responsible for cleaning up after their dog. Any dogs relieving them selves in the show ring may be disqualized from class at the digression of the judge.

21. Youth Dog Show Definitions:

Courses shall have a minimum of 3 Advanced level stations plus 1 required jump perclass.A lowed jumps are the high jump, bar jump and broad jump.Signs 1-118 from the AKC Rally Regulations may be used.
- Excelent is fordog and handler teams meady to perform o lead at a more advanced level. Dogs who have earned a qualifying score at the Excelent, or sim lar level, from any organization must enter this class.

- 1. The SRFG eneral Rules and Regulations apply to this Division and Shows.
- 2. Health Requirem ents:
 - a. 5C-40017 General Requirements & Limitations.
 - b. 5C-4005 Goat:0 irialCertificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) from a veterinarian. Fbrida-origin goats presented for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation. Goats in ported into Fbrida for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI completed within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - c. A lentered goats registered, unregistered, orgrade must have a scrapie D (Individual Elentfication) num ber that meets the identification requirements mandated by the USDA (APHE 91-55-066, June 1, 2005).
 - d. Goats shallbe free of any health or skin illnesses, and free of lice.
 - e. Algoats must be polled or have their horns either tipped or cushioned with a material to help prevent injury to the exhibitor. No tipping of horns on the show grounds.
 - f. Each exhibitor must provide their own equipment to maintain the health of their animaland the cleanliness of their pens. Bring latching device for pengates. ALL EXH BITORS ARE REQUIRED TO FEED and WATER UNTLAN MALS ARE REMOVED FROM BARN. If animal(s) is not tended to, Fair Premiums and/or Eligibility may be revoked if conditions continue. Bedding, is provided by the fair.

3. Shows and Classes:

- a. Spectators, parents and/orbreeders are not allowed in the back once exhibitors are in line to show .
- b. Meatand Daily goats are separate shows. A goat cannot be shown in both shows.
- c. Only 1goatperclass is allowed to be shown. There must be a minimum of 5 exhibitors to host a show. In the event of limited entries, the non-qualifying show exhibitors can still participate in the running show and will be judged to that show standard.
- d. Pygm y goats are allowed only in the meat classes and will be judged to meat standards.
- e. No Bucks will be a lowed to show.
- f. Does over 24 m on the that have not kidded cannot be shown.
- g. Alshows are **BLOW** and GO (sham poo & bbw -dry).No products of any kind. If you have groom ing products on your animalyou will not show.
- h. Base Date is the age of the animalon the day of the show . Date of bith ${\tt m}\,{\tt ust}\,{\tt be}\,$ included on entry form .
- i. Exhibitors will be allowed to use halters or collars in the show ring.
- j. Exhibitors will be in control of their goat at all times or they may be dism issed/ disqualified from the show.

4. Proof of 0 wnership:

- a. A llanimals must be owned or leased by the show entry deadline. Lease agreementmust be attached to entry form.
- b. Scrapie/Premise D orTattoo D must be included on entry form or entry will be considered incomplete and not accepted.
- c. A lexhbios entries owned or based must maintain continuous fullow nership, possession and provide primary care for their animal project from time of entry until show day. If at entry time the animal is not in the exhibitor's possession the entry will be invalid and no refund given. A farm visit is up to the discretion of the SRF badership.
- d. Only doe goats owned the entire duration as the entry form may be subbed out in the case of death persuperintendent approval.

5. Show Entry:

- a. Algoats must be checked in after vet check. A lanimals not checked in will be considered 'N o Show s" and will be deleted from the show.
- b. Goats with Tattoos will need to bring their registration paperwork at check-in.
- c. Only animals exhibited, entered, shown and checked by the State health inspectors will be allowed in the barn. No exceptions. Kils under 3 m on the of age and stillnursing their dam may be brought into the barn after check-in. If kils are buckling is they will not be part of the show.
- d. Once animals are checked in they cannot have the grounds until show is complete.
- e. Algoats must be broken to lead, clipped and washed prior to anivalat the faigrounds. See W etherRules for clipping instructions.

(SEI- Safety Equipment Institute, ASTM -American Society of Testing and Measures).

 - e. Sw ine will be weighed only once. The exhibitor, at this time, may request the animal be removed from the scales, the scales re-balanced and the animal in mediately re-weighed.
- 4. Swine Divisions and Classes
 - a. Sw ine willbe weighed and placed in classes with similar weights. Classes willbe separated into divisions. Divisions are determined by fairboard and/orsw ine committee. A Division Champion and Reserve Champion willbe named in each division.
 - b. The last division will be a "Purebred O nly Division". Purebred Division winners will still compete for Overall Top 5.
 - c. Eligible breeds: Hampshire, Berkshire, Yorkshire, Duroc, Landrace, Chester, Spot, Hereford, or Tam worth
 - d. Purebred C hasses in the hat division will be split based on num berofentries and according to weight 12 orm one entries will be split in to two classes "a lighter weight class and a heavierweight class."
 - e. Purebued Registration papers M UST BE in the exhibitor's name and address by the M arch W eigh h.A copy of the registration paperwill need to be provided, checked, and verfied at the M arch weigh h.
 - f. Purebred gilts and barrows will need to meeteligibility requirements of their respective breed for a markethog.
 - g. Any so-called purebred that does not meet these requirements can still show in the regular division just cannot compete in the "Purebred Only Division."

- h. Exhibitors are still only allowed one animalyou just choose the crossbred or purebred division.
- 5. Clipping is allowed in designated areas or in pen. Violation is subject to rem oval from show and sale.Recommended Clipping:No ShorterThan 3/8 inch.
- 6. The wash area next to the goat barn and facing the concession stand is forwashing of swine only. NO clipping or electrical equipmental bwed.
- 7. Exhibitors must provide an automatic watering system for their hog. Each animal/ fam ily must have their own su icient water source.
- 8. Show ring in plements must be of proper size and dimension for the exhibitor. Permitted show ring in plements are flexible whips, crops, and bats.NO wooden canes and PVC pipes.
- 9. No swine may change their assigned pen without authorization of a fairo it al.
- 10. No hay is allowed in the swine pens.
- 11. A B% sales commission and a pork check-o fee of 0045% of market (resale) value, as required by law, will be deducted from the exhibitor's proceeds.
- 12. "Swine Committee" Scholarship is o ered to graduating Seniors. See Scholarships Awards for selection criteria.
